

Animal Ambassadors Get An Upgrade! By: Michelle Berns

In October of 2024, we received a very generous grant from the Roy J. Carver Charitable Trust. This grant has allowed us to upgrade our animal enclosures, life support filtration system, and improve our raptor cages. We are excited to announce that most of the upgrades have been completed except the raptor enclosures which will be done in late summer/early fall and updated signage.

As you first enter the nature center, you will notice on your left a very large aquarium for two of our aquatic turtles, Tim and Murtle. Tim, our Red-Eared Slider has not been on public display for many years so we are ecstatic that he has a new place where he can charm everyone who walks in. He swims right up to the front of the aquarium as if he is saying, "what's up?" This aquarium is a wonderful addition with a huge area to swim in and a very nice basking platform.

The other two aquatic turtles, Mr. B, the Blanding's Turtle and Sheldon, the Softshell Turtle reside in their original spots. They have new, larger aquariums for extended swimming periods and ramps that allow them to access basking platforms under the artificial sun lights. The best aspect, in my opinion, is that all of our aquatic turtles are on the same life support system as our fish! What does this mean for them? Cleaner and healthier water and a constant flow of fresh water.

Twenty years ago, our life support filtration system was top-of-the-line, with a three-step cleaning process, including canister filters, a bio-reactor, and UV sterilization. Both of the 1200-gallon aquariums only needed a complete empty and cleaning twice a year. About five years ago, finding replacement parts



such as filters and gaskets became more challenging as those companies disbanded.

Technology is always evolving, so our staff took a trip to the National Mississippi River Museum to view their set-up. Their state-of-the-art aquariums with both freshwater and saltwater animals are amazing. Staff gave us a tour and some great advice on how to proceed.

Throughout the competitive bidding process, we found Aquatic Environments in Davenport. They had raving reviews from other nature centers in the area doing similar upgrades.

We now have a great filtration system that should keep the aquariums cleaner with less maintenance. The new system utilizes a carbon block system to remove the city water chlorine as



well as our current UV sterilizers, bio-digesters (bacteria to eat fish poo and other organic material), and an ozone generator to counteract some of that organic material created.

We are excited to give our animal ambassadors more space to roam and healthier habitats!

Stop by 7 days a week and see for yourself the changes that are happening. We are open 8:00-4:30 Monday through Friday and 12:00-4:00 Saturday and Sunday. As always it is free to come in. If you have questions about anything just holler! See you Soon!



The Highway Blues by Luke Hart

On Thursday, February 27th 2025, MCCB received a call from a sheriff's deputy that an injured red-tailed hawk was sighted in the median of Hwy 61, near Tucker Avenue in Muscatine County



Conservation staff quickly gathered supplies to contain the bird and headed out to the site. Unfortunately, due to a serious head trauma event, the hawk had already passed away on the highway.



Busy highways with spattering's of woodlands are scenic for humans, but are certainly not good places for these beautiful animals to be hunting. For much of Iowa, though, this marginal habitat is all that is left.



Restoration of healthy, contiguous woodlands, prairies and wetlands is certainly the best option for protecting our wildlife, but there are a few simple driving habits that humans can exhibit to help mitigate the loss.

First, don't toss food out your car window; it attracts wildlife to the roadside, potentially causing a chain reaction of accidents.

Second, keep your eyes peeled for scavengers eating roadkill, or perched on fence posts, power lines, or roadside trees. This is a great way to develop that "search image" to help you anticipate a potential bird "swoop down" or "fly off."

Lastly, and probably most importantly, slow down. Until we have better habitat options for wildlife, we'll have to accept that we're sharing the road with them. Be careful out there. Thank you!


Pearl City Buckskinner Rendezvous - Discovery Park - Free, Family Event.



Online Reservations - Coming Soon!!

Starting on April 1, 2025, we are hoping to roll out an easier way to reserve campsites, cabins, picnic shelters, and the Saulsbury Lodge.

The online reservations will go through the MyCountyParks.com/County/Muscatine website. All 99 counties in Iowa are featured on this site, but not all of them participate in the e-commerce option. People will also be able to register and pay for some of our environmental education camps and programs.

We are expecting a few growing pains as our customers and staff adjust to the new process. We anticipate that many of you will love the ease of making a reservation. Website data shows the majority of the online reservations are made late in the evening when offices are closed, from a phone or tablet. We would speculate, those people are sprawled out on a comfy couch, in their jammies, making plans for their next adventure.

Picnic Shelters: We have six reservable shelters that will be open to online reservations. These are great for summer birthdays, reunions, youth groups, and religious groups. There are 3 shelters at Discovery Park, 2 at Saulsbury Bridge Recreation Area, and 1 at Jack Shuger.



Campgrounds: Campers wishing to stay in the main campground at Saulsbury will need to make online reservations (once the system is up and running). Reservations will need to be made a least 3-days in advance. The River Campground and Tent Only area will still be first come, first served.

Cabins: Guests will appreciate the ability to make an online reservation for the 4 cabins at Deep Lakes Park. The process will be similar to reserving a hotel, there will be no need for our office to be physically open to book your stay.

Saulsbury Lodge: The Lodge will continue to be available for day use groups, and weekend weddings.

We will update Facebook and our Websites once the online reservations go live! Stay tuned...



New Campground Coming to Deep Lakes Park

We are excited to announce that construction for a new full hook-up campground will be underway soon at Deep Lakes Park.

Designed by Bolton & Menk, this new campground will feature sewer, water, and electric at each site. The DLP Campground will be located on the North side of the park, with the entrance off 41st Street.

Triple B Construction will be the general contractor working on the project. In addition to building the campground roads, they will be installing a Huffcut shower house, and 22 paved campsites.

We do not anticipate an interruption for park visitors except for an increase in construction traffic on the North side of the park, and near the hard-surfaced trail. Cyclists, walkers, and joggers will be able to view the progress throughout the summer.

The campground is expected to be complete by the end of 2025. Sites will be reservable online, and open for business in 2026!
